
One VVO ticket for all public transport



Within the region of the transport executive upper Elbe (VVO) you can travel with ease – get one ticket for all trains, busses, trams and most ferries.

The VVO area

The VVO area is divided into 21 tariff zones. Whichever form of transport you use, and however often you get on and off, the prices you pay are based on these zones which you can distinguish by their numbers and different colours. On each journey you pay for the tariff zones that you travel through. So you can see how much your ticket will cost from the tariff overview.



Example

- Dresden = 1 tariff zone
- Dresden and Pirna = 2 tariff zones
- Dresden to Meißen = 3 tariff zones

Reductions with the Dresden Pass

TIP In Dresden you can use reduced tickets (4-ride tickets, monthly and Abo-monthly passes) together with a Dresden Pass. To get a Dresden Pass, apply in person to the 'Sozialleistungen' department of the Dresden Sozialamt. Tickets are then issued at the Dresden transport companies' service centres.



Buying tickets

Where do you get your ticket?

You can get any ticket for the train, bus, tram or ferry at the transport companies' service centres, plus:

Tram **from ticket machines on trams**
these tickets come pre-stamped;
from ticket machines at tram stops
please stamp these tickets on the tram

Zug **from ticket machines at stations**
please stamp these tickets on the platform

BUS **from drivers on urban and regional buses**
these tickets come pre-stamped



Other information

- ➔ If you are buying your ticket from a Deutsche Bahn machine, you can change the machine display to English or French, for example.
- ➔ Please pay in the right form. The ticket machines and staff are unable to accept too many small coins or very large bank notes.
- ➔ Keep your stamped ticket available to show staff who might ask to see it.
- ➔ The ticket must be valid for all the tariff zones you travel through. If it isn't, or if you are unable to show a ticket, you will be asked to pay a penalty of 60 euros.



Conduct on bus and rail

- ➔  Bus and tram stops
Press the STOP button well before the stop where you want to get off.
- ➔ Let passengers get off before you get on.
- ➔ People with restricted mobility, pregnant women and passengers with small children have priority when using seats.
- ➔ Children should be supervised while travelling.
- ➔ Passengers may not climb or stand on seats, or put their feet on them.
- ➔ Eating and drinking is not permitted when travelling by bus or rail.
- ➔ Please do not talk loudly, and be considerate towards fellow passengers.
- ➔ Smoking is not permitted on vehicles or at stops.

Drivers and service personnel (both women and men) are responsible for applying rules of conduct in the vehicles.
